



UPDATED REGULATIONS FOR PRODUCT WARNINGS UNDER PROPOSITION 65

Dear Supply Chain Partner:

On August 30, 2018, California's Prop 65 warning requirements changed, requiring businesses to update their warning practices for Prop 65-triggering products. In 2016, the California state agency in charge of Prop 65 implementation, the Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment (OEHHA), published new regulations designed to provide consumers with additional information about the products they purchase. (Cal. Code Regs. tit. 27, § 26500 *et seq.*). Key changes under the new regulations include:

- Applicable warnings must identify at least one listed chemical present in the product associated with the toxicological endpoint (cancer or reproductive harm) for which the warning is being given; and
- Applicable warnings must include a triangle warning symbol (▲) and link to OEHHA's Proposition 65 information page: www.P65Warnings.ca.gov.
